

HOW TO GET TO WARRNAMBOOL

WARRNAMBOOL IS EASILY ACCESSIBLE VIA CAR, TRAIN OR BUS.

- 3 hour drive (260km) from Melbourne City (or Tullamarine Airport)
- 2 hours, 20 minutes (205km) from Avalon Airport
- 2 hours, 15 minutes (194km) from Mount Gambier Airport
- 7 hours (615km) from Adelaide City via Riddoch & Princess Highway

CAR

Warrnambool is 257 kilometres away from Melbourne CBD and will take approximately 3hrs to drive via the inland route or 5hrs and 30 mins via the Great Ocean Road. From the 12 Apostles - staying on the Great Ocean Road, travel west to the A1 at Allansford, before arriving in Warrnambool (80km or 1 hour 15 minutes).

VLine Train departs Southern Cross Station, Melbourne to Warrnambool up to 6 times per day.



Flagstaff Hill Maritime Museum & Village

Allow the maritime magic of Warrnambool unfold before your eyes at Flagstaff Hill Maritime Museum and Village. Stroll down the cobblestone streets of the 1800's maritime village and step into the past as you explore what life was like for the Shipwreck Coast's first European settlers. This is Victoria's most active maritime museum with Australia's most significant shipwreck artefact collection. Marvel at the Loch Ard Peacock, once

destined for the spotlight at the 1880 Melbourne International Exhibition, now proudly displayed at Flagstaff Hill Maritime Museum. Crafted by the skilled hands of French sculptor Paul Comolera, this majestic masterpiece defied the odds, washing ashore intact after the tragic Loch Ard shipwreck. Valued at \$4 million and listed on the Victorian Heritage Register, it stands as a timeless symbol of maritime history, a beacon of resilience amidst the tumultuous seas.

It's also home to the stories of hundreds of 19th Century ships, their crewmen and passengers, passed on by the lucky few who survived the journey to start a new life in a foreign land. Flagstaff Hill stands as a testament to the courageous souls who forged new beginnings in distant lands, laying the foundation for the Warrnambool we know today. Once you've enjoyed the historical village of over 40 buildings – including a school, fire station, boat builder's yards and even a blacksmith's forge, climb the hill which gives this site its name. Here you can scale the lighthouse staircase, inspect the 80-pound cannon and take in some of the best coastal views in Warrnambool.

Sailor's Secret - Capture a selfe with the mesmerising panorama of Lady Bay and Flagstaff Hill from the Visitor InformationCentre balcony - an image to cherish forever!

*Note: This itinerary includes the Day and Night package at Flagstaff Hill, which is recommended to be booked at least two weeksin advance due to sound and light show popularity. However, if the sound and light show does not appeal, regular day tickets can be purchased at the time of visit at the front desk.



The cruisy 10 minute drive continuing on from Cheeseworld, leads you to 3 beautiful coves with large seas and surf, sandstone stacks reminiscent of the iconic 12

Apostles and colourful sandstone and limestone cliffs, with Childers Cove being the main attraction. A photographer's playground, walking on these beaches is one of those rare experiences of solitude mixed with awe at the forces of nature. Not overly popular due to the big surf, stairs and soft sand, you'll likely only find yourself amongst the company of only a few others, who will also be awed by the cliffs, coves and coloured water.





From May to November, watch Southern Right Whales put on a show, tail-slapping and frolicking in Lady Bay, but the fun doesn't stop when they do. Year-round, the beach is a surfer's dream, a cliff-side explorer's haven, and a secret spot for some peaceful ocean views. Take a stroll past the Blue Hole, catch the waves, or snap a selfie with the cliffs as your backdrop.

Moyjil / Point Ritchie

Point Ritchie Road, Warrnambool

Just a stone's throw from Logan's Beach lies the mouth of the Hopkins River and the rocky headland revered by the local indigenous Whurrong people as 'Moyjil'. It's a place of profound connection, inviting visitors to pause, absorb, and breathe in its salty air.






